Gospel: *Luke 7: 36—8: 3, or 7: 36-50* (Lectionary #93)

You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment.

So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven because she has shown great love.

But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little.”

He said to her, “Your sins are forgiven.”

The others at table said to themselves, “Who is this who even forgives sins?”

But he said to the woman, “Your faith has saved you; go in peace.”

Afterward he journeyed from one town and village to another, preaching and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God.

Accompanying him were the Twelve and some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities,

Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out,

Joanna, the wife of Herod’s steward Chuza, Susanna, and many others who provided for them out of their resources.
