Jesus said to the Pharisees: “There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day.

The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment,  
he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side.

Abraham replied, ‘My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime  
while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented.

who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.’

He said, ‘Then I beg you, father, send him to my father’s house, for I have five brothers,
