

# 34th Annual Guitar and Ensemble Institute July 27-31, 2020 • Milford, Ohio

# INSTITUTE HIGHLIGHTS

- GEI is a five-day intensive program focused on the training and formation of adult music ministers who are leaders or participants in ensembles at their parish
- The schedule for this week includes: sessions on liturgy for both experienced and beginning leaders of liturgical song; techniques for guitar and bass, keyboard, percussion, obbligato, and voice; a sampling of new repertoire; and liturgical ensemble skill sessions; a track exclusively for directors
- The Institute also includes an open-mic night, shared meals, time for conversations and experience sharing, as well as late night jam sessions

## Institute Participants

GEI is an Institute for adults, age 18 and over only, who serve in a wide range of ministerial roles:

- For guitarists, who have the choice of two different levels: beginner/intermediate (Cortez) or intermediate/advanced (Fisher)
- For *all* instrumentalists who serve as part of worship ensembles
- For those who lead their ensembles as vocalists
- For music directors or those who lead ensembles
- For those who plan liturgies
- A track for anyone who seeks time for retreat and prayer to reflect on their relationship with God

#### **BOBBY FISHER**

FACULTY TEAM LEADER; ADV. GUITAR



Bobby Fisher is a world-renowned guitarist, recording artist, composer, and clinician. He has served a number of years as program coordinator for the NPM Guitar Schools and Guitar and Ensemble Institutes. Bobby has recorded and produced a number of his own recordings and has worked as producer and guest musician on countless others. With his daughter, Serenity, and her husband, Michael G. Ronstadt, he currently records and performs with Serenity Fisher and the Cardboard Hearts. Bobby has recorded and published a number of music collections for OCP, GIA, Franciscan Media, and Heart to

Heart Ministries, and is the author of *The Pastoral Guitarist*, a guitar instructional book, and *The Litur*gical Guitarist, an instructional video. As a children's recording artist, Bobby is best known for Hymns and Hers for Happy Hearts, a collection of fun and creative music for children, both young and old. Some of his best selling collections include Play Before God, Guitar Prayer, Catholic Classics Vol. III, If We Dare to Hope, and Go Out and Tell. Bobby lives in Cincinnati, Ohio with his wife and family.

Eileen has been involved in music ministry for many years, as a flutist, accompanist, choral director, alto in the choir, and performer. Since 1995, Eileen has travelled to Minneapolis to record on many David Haas liturgical music projects. Jaime Cortez is a talented and popular music composer, arranger, and performer. Born in New York and raised in El Salvador, Jaime completed the Bachelor Degree in composition from Arizona State University. While at ASU, he began leading music at the All Saints Catholic Newman Center in Tempe, Arizona, and has continued his service in the Diocese of Phoenix for over thirty years, currently as the director of music at Holy Cross Catholic Church in Mesa, Arizona. Jaime is well-known for composing music for the liturgy, specializing in songs for communities that speak English and Spanish. His music appears in

Breaking Bread, Flor y Canto, Journeysongs, Spirit & Song, and other popular music resources.

As a clinician, Jaime is dedicated to promoting better Hispanic liturgies and bringing cultures together for worship. He is a teacher of instruments and music ensembles, also leading workshops on pastoral music ministry and presenting parish missions, in both English and Spanish. His primary instrument is the guitar, though he is also proficient in piano and other string instruments, including the charango, vihuela, and bass guitar. He has been a member of the Liturgical Composers Forum since 1998 where he serves as a member of the steering committee. Jaime was named *Pastoral Musician of the Year* in 2016 by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM).

BONNIE FABER VOICE



Bonnie started her career as a music teacher, and to this day she maintains the clear, methodical manner of an educator. She has worked in music ministry in the Archdiocese of Minneapolis and St. Paul archdiocese for more than five decades, including teaching at the School of Divinity at the University of St. Thomas. Ken Gilman, PhD, in addition to practicing psychology has a music habit. He began study of the violin at age ten. His principal gig is music director at St. Michael and All Angels in Albuquerque, a position he has held since 2005. ensembles in Maine, the Canadian Maritimes, and Belgium before returning to his roots in New Mexico in 2003. He is passionate about the intentional and thoughtful blending of disparate voices into the community that is "ensemble" in all its permutations.

music ministry, proclamation of Word, and the importance of music within the liturgical experience. ## REGISTRATION INFORMATION

#### Membership Requirement

- The 2020 NPM Guitar and Ensemble Institute is open to NPM members only
  - For NPM Parish Members, anyone in the parish is eligible to register at the member rate. If your name is in the parish membership, enter your own member number. If your name is not on the parish membership, include the parish group number on your registration form
  - For NPM <u>Individual</u> Members, please note your member number on the registration form
- You may join NPM at any time by submitting a Membership Application or Renewal form

#### Tuition Rates

- The Advance Registration rate applies to all registrations received by June 26, 2020. The Regular Registration rate applies for any registrations received on or after June 27. 2020
- The tuition fee includes group sessions, individual coaching, materials, t-shirt (if registered by June 26) and all meals as noted during the course of the Institute
  - Resident: includes housing and all meals from Sunday evening through Friday breakfast
  - Commuter: includes all meals from Monday lunch through Friday breakfast
- DEADLINE: All registrations must be completed online, or received by mail or fax, no later than July 13, 2020

#### CONFIRMATION AND CANCELLATION

- Cancellations:
  - All cancellations must be received in writing.
  - Cancellations received after June 1 will incur a cancellation fee of \$300.
  - No refunds after July 13. In the event that this program must be canceled due to low enrollment, that decision will be made at least three weeks prior to the scheduled starting date, and registered participants will receive a full refund of fees paid to NPM.
  - Since NPM cannot offer reimbursement of travel fees, we recommend that if registrants book nonrefundable flights, not to do so more than twenty-one days before the Institute begins
